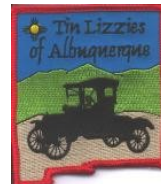

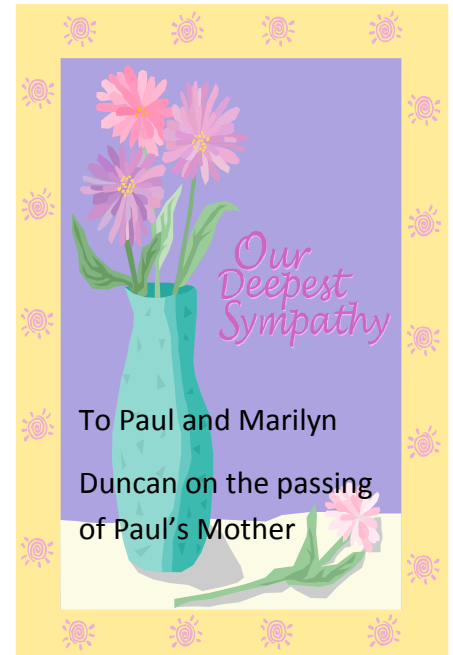
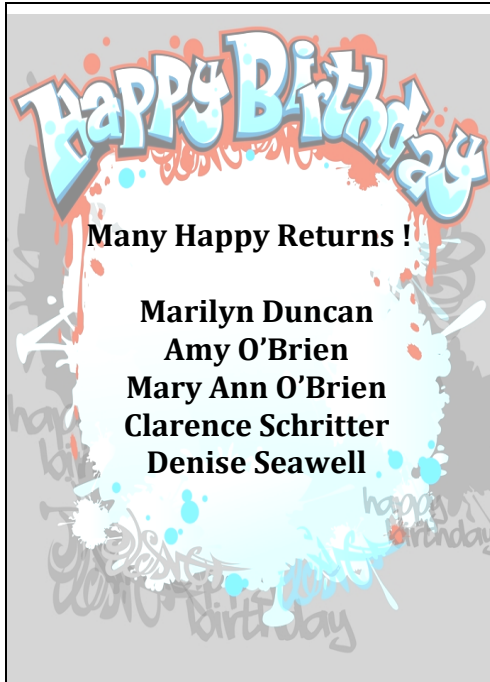
The cone race was next . From a starting point two cars were lined up and raced to the cones. Who stopped first without knocking over the cone? Mark Dominguez

Los Alamos Tour: Dean talked to Skip Dunn & it was decided to postpone the Tour until next year. All are still invited to go to Los Alamos & participate in the Parade on Aug 11. Some plan to go there on Fri evening & spend the night before attending the parade on Sat.

Rough Rider Tour: Larry gave an update of the plans for the "Rough Rider Tour", August 23-26. This tour will be held in Las Vegas, NM. He also announced the Work Day this coming Sat, & the 4th of July Parade & Bar B Q at the Azevedo's. The parade starts at 10A & lines up at 9A. You are invited to decorate your car ahead of time at the Azevedo's. Be there by about 8A & afterward we will drive to the staging area together.

Raffle Ticket Update: Larry Azevedo reported on the raffle ticket sales for the engine. 355 tickets have been sold, so we have about 160 more to sell. He, as well as several others, has tickets to sell for \$10 each. He talked about the finances & that the pot is short \$70 after doing an audit of all tickets sold. He made a motion to take \$70 out of our treasury to equalize the pot. The motion was seconded & was passed by the membership.

Kirk Peterson advised he has 20 people signed up for the Rough Rider Tour, & only 2 have not paid the \$20 fee (& Larry)

Tom Miles said he is donating a Model A chassis to the Model A Club, & wants to donate a Model T chassis to the Tin Lizzies. This matter is tabled until our next meeting.

We had our break & visiting time

Lorna Azevedo said there were lots of vintage & vintage look-dresses worn at the Lincoln Tour banquet. Many ladies there said they were inspired to dress up while attending our Business Meeting held here in March.

TOUR TIDBITS.....

This is the tentative schedule for the tour. We will keep you updated as things change.

We are heading to Las Vegas, NM for our yearly adventure.

We will be staying at the Historical Plaza Hotel (on the Plaza)! The rates are \$78 single, \$88 double occupancy. Check in is 3PM..Check out is 11AM.

Call the hotel to make reservations at [800-328-1882](tel:800-328-1882) or [505-425-3591](tel:505-425-3591)...be sure to refer to the Tin Lizzies of Albuquerque to get our special rates!

Cancellation Policy is to call 24 hrs prior to the day of arrival by 3:00PM

All rooms come with complimentary hot breakfast each morning in the Landmark Grill downstairs off the main lobby.

There is high speed internet throughout the hotel, & a complimentary computer located in the lobby.

Check out the Plaza Hotel website for the amenities.

We will have a Hospitality Room located on the lower level. This is our room to have our Happy Hours & general "get togethers" during our stay. It's Salon A.

There is not water/sink in the hospitality room, so plan for our snacks accordingly., We will have a small fridge and a cooler for drinks in the hospitality room. A fridge is available for your room for an extra charge. There is a microwave in the lobby for our use.

The hotel has a restaurant called the Landmark Grill, open 7 days a week, serving breakfast, lunch, & dinner.

It also has a saloon, Bryon T's Saloon, open 7 days a week at 12 noon, full bar, food available till 9PM... music at times...not sure of that schedule.

Parking is open. They recommend the Police Dept parking lot if you don't have a trailer. It's located across the plaza from the hotel. Trailer parking is just down the street from the hotel. Directions will be provided.

Summer often brings music to the gazebo across the street on the plaza.

Vintage clothing is recommended (but not demanded) for our banquet.

If you need more sustenance, you can eat at the hotel or another restaurant of your choice. (A restaurant guide will be provided)
