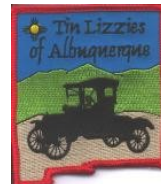

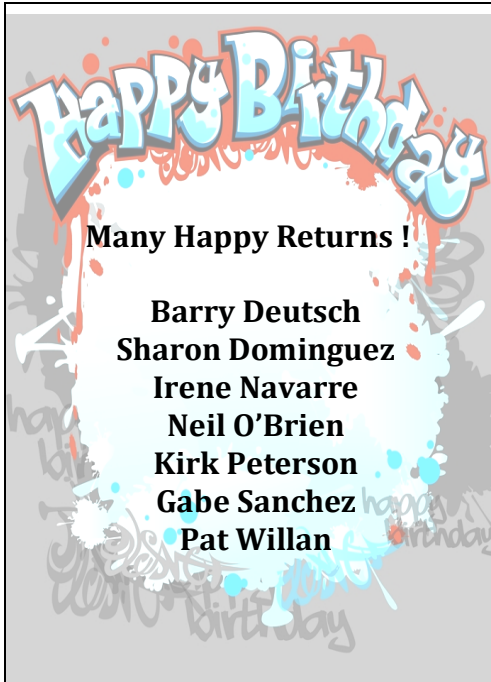

## Minutes of our last meeting

### TIN LIZZIES OF ALBUQUERQUE MEETING MINUTES

July 26, 2012

**President**, Dean Van Doren, called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by the membership.

There were no new members or guests. Dean told us his Grandson, Dante, is our newest member, but wasn't in attendance.

Dean announced that the refreshments tonight were provided by Vaughn Rockafellow & Mark & Susan Wing.

Dean discussed the ticket sales for the museum engine raffle. We have sold the 500 tickets as advertised, but because the Vintage Ford said there are ticket sales through Aug 15, we have many more people trying to buy tickets. To maintain our credibility, we will go ahead with the 500 ticket limit on the first engine. Larry Azevedo has offered to do a second engine with the Tin Lizzie group. This is a group project, so we need member input. We will go ahead & limit the drawing to the first 500 tickets, & possibly proceed with a second engine. Larry made a motion to be consistent with the Vintage Ford deadline of Aug 15 for ticket sales on the second engine, also, or 500 more tickets whichever comes last. The motion was seconded by Robbi Ross, discussion was held, & the motion was passed by the membership. Dean has an engine & lots of parts to start with & will donate a block & other items. Larry & Tom Miles will call all the folks that are not in the first 500 tickets to see if they want to be in the drawing for the second engine, or not. If they don't, we will return their money. Mary Ann O'Brien said the 2<sup>nd</sup> engine will have to be picked up or shipped from Alb. We will have the drawing for the first engine at the Sept meeting.

Dean awarded the coveted "Chicken Award" to Don Mitchell for his little mishap at the July 4<sup>th</sup> parade in Corrales. Don will sign it & keep it until the next Lizzie has a car problem. Then in the time honored tradition, it will be passed on to the next lucky recipient.

**Secretary's Report:** Lorna Azevedo gave the Secretary's Report. There were no corrections or additions to the minutes from the July newsletter.

This is the tentative schedule for the tour. We will keep you updated as things change.

We are heading to Las Vegas, NM for our yearly adventure.

We will be staying at the Historical Plaza Hotel (on the Plaza)! The rates are \$78 single, \$88 double occupancy. Check in is 3PM..Check out is 11AM.

Call the hotel to make reservations at [800-328-1882](tel:800-328-1882) or [505-425-3591](tel:505-425-3591)...be sure to refer to the Tin Lizzies of Albuquerque to get our special rates!

Cancellation Policy is to call 24 hrs prior to the day of arrival by 3:00PM

All rooms come with complimentary hot breakfast each morning in the Landmark Grill downstairs off the main lobby.

There is high speed internet throughout the hotel, & a complimentary computer located in the lobby.

Check out the Plaza Hotel website for the amenities.

We will have a Hospitality Room located on the lower level. This is our room to have our Happy Hours & general "get togethers" during our stay. It's Salon A.

There is not water/sink in the hospitality room, so plan for our snacks accordingly., We will have a small fridge and a cooler for drinks in the hospitality room. A fridge is available for your room for an extra charge. There is a microwave in the lobby for our use.

The hotel has a restaurant called the Landmark Grill, open 7 days a week, serving breakfast, lunch, & dinner.
